Safety Observations



What is a Safety Observation?

- Safety observations involve identifying and addressing workplace hazards before incidents occur.
- What is your company/organization's goal with safety observations?
- What type of observations?
 - Formal Checklist/App/Forms
 - Informal Gemba Walks/Peer-to-Peer
- Do you see benefits from safety observations?



Effective Safety Observation Practices?

- Be Specific Describe what you see (unsafe act vs. unsafe condition)
- Engage Workers Ask for their perspective rather than just pointing out issues
- Use Positive Reinforcement Recognize safe behaviors as much as unsafe ones
- Follow Up Ensure corrective actions are implemented



Safety Observation Scenarios

- Scenario 1: Improper PPE
 - Key Takeaways:
 - Empathy First
 - Reinforce Safety
 - Positive Framing
 - Lead by Example

- Scenario 2: Blocked Emergency Exits
 - Key Takeaways:
 - Safety Over Convenience
 - Immediate Action
 - Teamwork & Solutions
 - Accountability Without Blame



Safety Observation Scenarios

- Scenario 3: Unsafe Ladder Use
 - Key Takeaways:
 - Time vs. Safety
 - Provide Alternatives
 - Encourage Reporting
 - Build a Safety Habit
